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1B.3 Sexual Violence Policy 3

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Part 1. Policy statement.

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Sexual violence is an intolerable intrusion into the most personal and private rights of an 7 individual, and is prohibited at Minnesota State Colleges and Universities. Minnesota 8 State Colleges and Universities is committed to eliminating sexual violence in all forms 9 and will take appropriate remedial action against any individual found responsible for 10 acts in violation of this policy. Acts of sexual violence may also constitute violations of 11 criminal or civil law, or other Board Policies that may require separate proceedings. To 12 further its commitment against sexual violence, Minnesota State Colleges and 13 Universities provides reporting options, an investigative and disciplinary process and 14 prevention training or other related services as appropriate. 15

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Subpart A. Application of policy to students, employees, and others. This 17 policy applies to all Minnesota State Colleges and Universities students and 18 employees and to others, as appropriate, where incidents of sexual violence on 19 system property have been reported. Reports of sexual violence committed by a 20 student at a location other than on system property are covered by this policy 21 pursuant to the factors listed in Board Policy 3.6, Part 2. Reports of sexual 22 violence committed by a system employee at a location other than system 23 property are covered by this policy. 24

Reports of sexual violence committed on system property by individuals who are 26 not students or employees are subject to appropriate actions by Minnesota State 27 Colleges and Universities, including, but not limited to, pursuing criminal or civil 28 action against them. 29

- Subpart B. College and university policies. Each Minnesota State Colleges 33 34 and Universities college and university shall adopt a clear, understandable written

43 44 45 46	Subpart A. Sexual violence. Sexual violence includes a continuum of conduct that includes sexual assault, and non-forcible sex acts, <u>dating and relationship</u> <u>violence, stalking</u> , as well as aiding acts of sexual violence.
40 47 48 49 50 51 52 53	Subpart B. Sexual assault . "Sexual assault" means an actual, attempted, or threatened sexual act with another person without that person's consent. Sexual assault is often a criminal act that can be prosecuted under Minnesota law, as well as form the basis for discipline under Minnesota State Colleges and Universities student conduct codes and employee disciplinary standards. Sexual assault includes but is not limited to:
54 55 56 57 58 59	1. Involvement without consent in any sexual act in which there is force, expressed or implied, or use of duress or deception upon the victim. Forced sexual intercourse is included in this definition, as are the acts commonly referred to as "date rape" or "acquaintance rape." This definition also includes the coercing, forcing, or attempting to coerce or force sexual intercourse or a sexual act on another.
60 61 62 63 64	 Involvement in any sexual act when the victim is unable to give consent. Intentional and unwelcome touching, or coercing, forcing, or attempting to coerce or force another to touch a person's intimate parts (defined as primary genital area, groin, inner thigh, buttocks, or breast). Offensive sexual behavior that is directed at another such as indecent
65 66 67 68 69 70 71	exposure or voyeurism. <u>Subpart C. Dating and relationship violence. Dating and relationship</u> <u>violence includes physical harm or abuse, and threats of physical harm or</u> <u>abuse, arising out of a personal intimate relationship. Individuals in the</u> <u>relationship may be married or not married; heterosexual, gay or lesbian; and</u> <u>in a long term or short term relationship. This violence also may be called</u>
72 73 74	domestic abuse or spousal/partner abuse and may be subject to criminal prosecution under Minnesota state law.
75 76 77 78 79	Subpart D. Stalking. Stalking is conduct directed at a specific person that is unwanted, unwelcome, or unreciprocated and that would cause a reasonable person to fear for her or his safety or the safety of others or to suffer substantial emotional distress.
80 81	Subpart <u>E</u>-C. Consent. Consent is informed, freely given and mutually understood. If coercion, intimidation, threats, and/or physical force are used,

there is no consent. If the complainant is mentally or physically incapacitated or 82 impaired so that the complainant cannot understand the fact, nature, or extent of 83 the sexual situation, there is no consent; this includes conditions due to alcohol or 84 drug consumption, or being asleep or unconscious. Silence does not necessarily 85 constitute consent, and past consent of sexual activities does not imply ongoing 86 future consent. Whether the respondent has taken advantage of a position of 87 influence over the complainant may be a factor in determining consent. 88

Subpart FD. Non-forcible sex acts. Non-forcible acts include unlawful sexual 90 acts where consent is not relevant, such as sexual contact with an individual under the statutory age of consent, as defined by Minnesota law, or between persons 92 who are related to each other within degrees wherein marriage is prohibited by 93 law. 94

Subpart GE. System property. "System property" means the facilities and land 96 owned, leased, or under the primary control of Minnesota State Colleges and 97 Universities, its Board of Trustees, system office, colleges and universities. 98

Subpart HF. Employee. "Employee" means any individual employed by 100 Minnesota State Colleges and Universities, its colleges and universities and 101 system office, including student workers. 102

- Subpart IG. Student. The term "student" includes all persons who: 104
 - 1. Are enrolled in one or more courses, either credit or non-credit, through a college or university;
- 2. Withdraw, transfer or graduate, after an alleged violation of the student 107 conduct code: 108
- 3. Are not officially enrolled for a particular term but who have a continuing 109 relationship with the college or university; or 110
- 4. Have been notified of their acceptance for admission or have initiated the 111 process of application for admission or financial aid; or 112
- 5. Are not college or university employees and are not enrolled in the institution 113 114 but live in a college or university residence hall.
