

#### Post-camp survey results

- Spending time on a university campus helped students better understand and visualize themselves at college:
  - Winona State University Camp = 96%
  - Urban/Augsburg Camp = 98%
  - Saint Paul College Camp = 89%
- Students' satisfaction with the overall camp experience:
  - Winona State University Camp = 97%
  - Urban/Augsburg Camp = 99%
  - Saint Paul College Camp = 97%

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# Legislative Charge (SF1236)

Minnesota State Colleges and Universities (MnSCU) will convene a summit and develop a plan that identifies ways to:

- Increase the number of qualified people working at all levels of our mental health system
- Ensure appropriate coursework and training
- Create a more culturally diverse mental health workforce

As required, the plan was submitted to the legislature January 15, 2015.




