# MINNESOTA STATE COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES\* ARTICULATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN

Northcentral Technical College (NTC)

AND

Minnesota State University, Mankato (MSU-M)

\*The Board of Trustees of the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities is authorized by Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 136F to enter into Agreements and has delegated this authority to colleges and universities.

This Agreement is entered into between Northcentral Technical College (NTC) at 1000 W Campus Drive, Wausau, WI 54401 (hereinafter sending institution), and Minnesota State University, Mankato (MSU-M) at 228 Wicking CTR, Mankato, MN 56001 (hereinafter receiving institution). This Agreement and any amendments and supplements, shall be interpreted pursuant to the laws of the State of Minnesota.

The sending institution has established a Dental Hygiene Program where students receive an Associate of Applied Science degree (hereinafter sending program), and the receiving institution has established a Dental Hygiene BS Degree Completion Program where students receive a Bachelor of Science Degree in Dental Hygiene (hereinafter receiving program), and will facilitate credit transfer and provide a smooth transition from one related program to another. It is mutually agreed:

#### **Admission and Graduation Requirements**

- A. The receiving institution's admission and program admission requirements apply to both direct entry students and to students who transfer under this agreement.
- B. Students must fulfill the graduation requirements at both institutions.
- C. Students must complete the entire sending program and meet the receiving institution's admission requirements for the agreement to apply, including grade requirements for courses and an overall GPA requirement.

#### **Transfer of Credits**

- A. The receiving institution will accept a minimum of 70 credits from the sending program. A total of 50 credits remain to complete the receiving program.
  - a. If the student has taken more than the minimum number of credits at the sending institution, these will be individually evaluated by the registrar's office. If additional general education courses taken meet general education requirements at MSU-M, the total number of credits to complete at the receiving program may be reduced.
- B. Courses will transfer as described in the attached Program Articulation Table. For system institutions, once the courses are encoded, they will transfer as described in the "Transferology" audit.

#### Implementation and Review

- A. The Chief Academic Officers or designees of the parties to this agreement will implement the terms of this agreement, including identifying and incorporating any changes into subsequent agreements, assuring compliance with system policy, procedure and guidelines, and conducting a periodic review of this agreement.
- B. This Articulation Agreement is effective on 06/01/2019 and shall remain in effect until 5/30/2024 or for five years, whichever occurs first, unless terminated or amended by either party with 90 days prior written notice.
- C. The college and university shall work with students to resolve the transfer of courses should changes to either program occur while the agreement is in effect.
- D. This Articulation Agreement will be reviewed by both parties beginning 11/01/2023 (within six months of the end date).

- E. When a student notifies the receiving institution of their intent to follow this agreement, the receiving institution will encode course waivers and substitutions.
- F. The Dental Hygiene Program at NTC will maintain accreditation from the Commission on Dental Accreditation (CODA). CODA ensures that coursework within the Dental Hygiene Program meets minimum competency standards within the profession of Dental Hygiene. Failure to maintain accreditation will result in cancellation of this agreement. However, the parties agree that arrangements will be made for students participating in the program at the time of cancellation to complete their program.

Post-secondary coursework completed by students outside of the Dental Hygiene Program at Northcentral Technical College will be evaluated by the MSU-M Admissions and/or Registrar's Office for potential transferability towards General Education requirements or as electives. These additional credits have potential to reduce number of credits needed at MSU-M.
