MINNESOTA STATE COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES* ARTICULATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN

ROCHESTER COMMUNITY AND TECHNICAL COLLEGE AND

SAINT MARY'S UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA

*The Board of Trustees of the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities is authorized by Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 136F to enter into Agreements and has delegated this authority to colleges and universities.

This Agreement is entered into between ROCHESTER COMMUNITY AND TECHNICAL COLLEGE (RCTC) (hereinafter sending institution), and SAINT MARY'S UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA (SMUMN) (hereinafter receiving institution). This Agreement and any amendments and supplements, shall be interpreted pursuant to the laws of the State of Minnesota.

The sending institution has established an A.S. in ALCOHOL AND DRUG COUNSELING (hereinafter sending program), and the receiving institution has established a B.S. in APPLIED **PSYCHOLOGY** hereinafter receiving program), and will facilitate credit transfer and provide a smooth transition from one related program to another. It is mutually agreed:

Admission and Graduation Requirements

- A. The receiving institution's admission and program admission requirements apply to both direct entry students and to students who transfer under this agreement.
- B. Students must fulfill the graduation requirements at both institutions.
- C. Students must complete the entire sending program and meet the receiving institution's admission requirements for the agreement to apply.

Transfer of Credits

- A. The receiving institution will accept 60 credits from the sending program. A total of 60 credits remain to complete the receiving program (36 of these remaining credits need to be completed at Saint Mary's University).
- B. Courses will transfer as described in the attached Program Articulation Table. For system institutions, once the courses are encoded, they will transfer as described in Transferology.
- C. No credit will transfer for courses in which a grade of C- or lower was earned.
- D. No credit will transfer for courses which are pre-freshman level or remedial.
- E. Credit will not be awarded twice for the same learning, including any prior learning or life experience credit awarded.
- F. A maximum of 2.0 semester credits will be awarded for physical education activity courses.

Implementation and Review

- A. The Chief Academic Officers or designees of the parties to this agreement will implement the terms of this agreement, including identifying and incorporating any changes into subsequent agreements, assuring compliance with system policy, procedure and guidelines, and conducting a periodic review of this agreement.
- B. This Articulation Agreement is effective on 03/01/2021 and shall remain in effect until the end date of 03/01/2026 or for five years, whichever occurs first, unless terminated or amended by either party with 90 days prior written notice.
- C. The college and university shall work with students to resolve the transfer of courses should changes to either program occur while the agreement is in effect.
- D. This Articulation Agreement will be reviewed by both parties beginning 01/01/2026 (within six months of the end date).

E. When a student notifies the receiving institution of their intent to follow this agreement, the receiving institution will encode course waivers and substitutions.
