MINNESOTA STATE COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES* ARTICULATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN

Anoka – Ramsey Community College AND University of Wisconsin Superior

*The Board of Trustees of the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities is authorized by Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 136F to enter into Agreements and has delegated this authority to colleges and universities.

This Agreement is entered into between **Anoka – Ramsey Community College** (hereinafter sending institution), and **University of Wisconsin Superior** (hereinafter receiving institution). This Agreement and any amendments and supplements, shall be interpreted pursuant to the laws of the State of Minnesota.

The sending institution has established an **AFA in Creative Writing** (hereinafter sending program), and the receiving institution has established a **BA in Writing** (hereinafter receiving program), and will facilitate credit transfer and provide a smooth transition from one related program to another. It is mutually agreed:

Admission and Graduation Requirements

- A. The receiving institution's admission and program admission requirements apply to both direct entry students and to students who transfer under this agreement.
- B. Students must fulfill the graduation requirements at both institutions.
- C. Students must complete the entire sending program and meet the receiving institution's admission requirements for the agreement to apply.

Transfer of Credits

- A. The receiving institution will accept **60 credits** from the sending program. A total of **60 additional credits** remain to complete the receiving program.
- B. Courses will transfer as described in the attached Program Articulation Table. For system institutions, once the courses are encoded, they will transfer as described in the Transferology Audit.

Implementation and Review

- A. The Chief Academic Officers or designees of the parties to this agreement will implement the terms of this agreement, including identifying and incorporating any changes into subsequent agreements, assuring compliance with system policy, procedure and guidelines, and conducting a periodic review of this agreement.
- B. This Articulation Agreement is effective on **01/01/2022** and shall remain in effect until the end date of **01/01/2027** or for five years, whichever occurs first, unless terminated or amended by either party with 90 days prior written notice.
- C. The college and university shall work with students to resolve the transfer of courses should changes to either program occur while the agreement is in effect.
- D. This Articulation Agreement will be reviewed by both parties beginning **07/01/2026** (within six months of the end date).
- E. When a student notifies the receiving institution of their intent to follow this agreement, the receiving institution will encode course waivers and substitutions.

Since the MnTC requirements are complete with the AFA at ARCC, the general requirements for UW-Superior are considered complete also.

Distribution requirements are satisfied through completion of the (MnTC) listed. These criteria must be met to complete the MnTC: 1. All ten emphasis areas listed below must be completed. 2. A total of at least 40 semester credits from courses listed in the MnTC must be satisfactorily completed. The additional 8 credits to meet the required 40 Minnesota Transfer Curriculum credits are embedded in the Program Requirements, as well as satisfying 6 of the 10 goal areas of the Minnesota Transfer Curriculum. One course may satisfy more than one emphasis area, but the course credits may be counted only once. Meet with an Anoka-Ramsey Advisor to select courses that will be counted in in multiple goal areas.

**Students who have completed the Associate of Arts, Associate of Science, or Associate of Arts and Science degree or the designated Minnesota Transfer (MnTC) curriculum, will have satisfied UW-Superior's general education requirements. The Associate of Fine Arts Degree also satisfies UW-Superior's general education requirements.

SECTION B - Major, Emphasis, Restricted and Unrestricted Electives or Other

(pre-requisite courses, required core courses, required courses in an emphasis, or electives (restricted or general) within the major). <u>Restricted electives (in Major)</u> fulfill a specific requirement within a major. Example A: "Chose two of the following three courses;" Example B: A Biology degree may require 40 science credits (20 credits of required courses + 20 credits of listed related courses, such as botany, genetics, sociobiology, etc. which students can select).
