FY 19 Perkins Monitoring Visits

The Minnesota State Colleges and Universities and the Minnesota Department of Education are required to monitor local Perkins consortia to assure compliance with fiscal and management requirements of the Perkins IV Act of 2006 and Minnesota state requirements. The monitoring review provides an opportunity to not only meet compliance requirements, but also provide technical assistance, foster continuous improvement, and develop a better understanding of local performance, operations and issues facing Career and Technical Education (CTE), schools and colleges.

In 2018-19 Minnesota will monitor six Local Perkins Consortia. The monitoring visit schedule is as follows:

When providing the evidence for each of the five criteria, consortia are asked to focus especially on the following areas:
